

Education Pathways and Funding 1 July 2020 – 30 June 2021

Hauraki PHO continues to support professional development for the general practice team. Members of the PHO team can offer expert clinical education to improve outcomes for patients requiring support with diabetes and cardiovascular illness and cervical screening. Clinical staff can access professional development opportunities via external Providers. The PHO Practice Support Team (PST) can provide the same service for practice managers and administrative staff. This Education Plan includes education and funding provided by external agencies and the mode of delivery. External education opportunities may vary depending on practice location.

PHO Responsibilities:

Hauraki PHO will provide additional support for professional development and staff retention by:

- Free access to Lippincott Library via Ko Awatea;
- Identification and mentoring future/existing Nurse Practitioner and Nurse Practitioner Interns and Registered Nurses in primary care on prescribing pathway;
- Co-chair six weekly meetings of Waikato Expert Nurse Peer Groups: Midland Nurse Practitioner Group (NPs/NP Interns) and Midland Designated RN Prescriber Group (Including trainees);
- Co-chair and facilitation of Midland Registered Nurse Prescribing in Community Program;
- Ongoing IT Investment to facilitate distance/online learning.

Practice Responsibilities:

Hauraki PHO will provide regularly updated details of external training Providers, online courses and any in-house education via weekly communications and the PHO website. There is an expectation that practice management will ensure all team members have electronic access to these, and will be responsible for arranging core training to cover the following topics:

- Treaty of Waitangi;
- Cultural Competency;
- Health and Disability Advocacy/Code of Rights;

- Privacy and Confidentiality;
- Health and Safety in the workplace;
- Vulnerable Children Act/Child Protection;
- Infection Control

Individual Responsibilities:

There is an expectation that clinicians will source education opportunities to maintain their Annual Practicing Certificate (ACP).
